Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo Moves Additional Outpatient Clinics to Oishei Children's Outpatient Center

Phase Three of Move Prior to the Grand Opening of Oishei Children's Hospital on November 10

BUFFALO, NY – Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo today moved 19 outpatient clinics from their existing location on Bryant Street to the Oishei Children's Outpatient Center located inside the Conventus building at 1001 Main Street.

The third phase of outpatient clinic moves includes the following:

The Hematology/Oncology, Cardiology, and Neurosurgery outpatient clinics will be moving to the Conventus building in late October and early November.

As of today, the majority of Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo's outpatient clinics will be open and fully operational to patients and families in their new location. The first two outpatient clinic moves were completed in January and April.

On November 10, the historic relocation will conclude with the move of Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo's inpatient services and emergency department to Oishei Children's Hospital.

The Oishei Children's Hospital will replace the current Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo, which is located on Bryant Street. The historic project will right-size and consolidate services in a 12-floor, 185-bed, free-standing, modern facility on the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus. It will be an integral part of the campus, linking with Buffalo General Medical Center, the Gates Vascular Institute, Roswell Park Cancer Institute, the new University at Buffalo Medical School and more. Not only will the Oishei Children's Hospital be the link for the Buffalo Niagara Medical Campus, but the hospital today – and in the future – will be the only link for comprehensive pediatric health care for Western New York. The Oishei Children's Hospital ensures pediatric and maternal services remain available for patients in the Western New York region. The vision for the new hospital is to be recognized as the innovator, the highest quality, highest value provider and partner, and the regional referral center for women and children's health care for Kaleida Health, Western New York and beyond. It is the only access point for pediatric critical care, Level III neonatal intensive care, and Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Centers in and for Western New York. The sickest babies and children come to the hospital for care, either directly or through transfers from other hospitals. Without the resources available at Women & Children's Hospital of Buffalo, these young patients would have to travel out of area for care.
